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Self-Isolation	Staff, Pupils, Parents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Staff or pupils who become symptomatic, to isolate, obtain a PCR test and if positive to stay home and continue to self-isolate, following Government advice. ➤ Staff or pupils who test positive using a lateral flow device (LFT) should self-isolate and seek a PCR test. If negative and no symptoms have developed, self-isolation can cease. ➤ Following a positive test, staff and children should self-isolate for 10 days but may be able to leave self-isolation after 5 full days, if they test negative on lateral flow tests, on days 5 and 6, providing the tests are taken 24 hours apart. 				✓

Clinically Vulnerable and Clinically Extremely Critically Vulnerable (CEV)	Staff, Pupils, Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ As a minimum CEV staff are to follow the same guidance as everyone else, the key issue is consultation with any vulnerable staff as per HSE advice and it is always advisable to document this discussion and agreement. ➤ If this is the case, a full risk assessment with the staff member should be undertaken and any discussion documented including the measures put in place to make the workplace as safe as possible for them. ➤ The CEV guidance extends to staff who are more than 28 weeks pregnant (and those below 28 weeks with other health concerns), but again only where they are fully aware of the risk to themselves and their unborn baby if they catch COVID. If they still want to work, they need to agree with you the safest way of working and advice may be required from occupational health. 		RP, SS	Ongoing	✓
