#### Maths

In maths this half term, we started by looking at place value. The children have enjoyed using place value charts to aid understanding and recognising the pictorial representations of numbers. Next the children will move onto addition and subtraction, where they can use and build upon their knowledge of strategies to complete calculations.

#### Art/ DT:

In Art, the children have been learning about different styles in art and have been creating their own depictions of these styles in their art books.

### Geography/History:

In History, we have begun looking into The Early British Empire, how we as a nation began the journey towards an empire and who helped us to do this.

In geography we have started our topic by looking at geographical tools on a globe, this will develop into the children learning why these are useful and then looking at our local area and how this has changed over time.



## English:

Over the half term, the children will be reading the graphic novel 'Tom's Midnight Garden'. The children will produce writing linked to the text

including class poems, diary entries, persuasive letters and then ending by writing their own graphic nov-



## Computing:

Computing will be taught in a full day block at the end of the term. The children will use a Chromebook to begin looking at how we can work collaboratively whilst being

online. They will look at sharing documents, creating presentations and spreadsheets, all collaboratively.



#### PE:

The children will be taking part in both swimming and indoor PE. For their indoor PE lessons, the children will be practising tag rugby, where they will develop the correct way to hold and pass a ball. Swimming will continue from where children

were last time and will be taught at Sowerby Bridge pool and fitness centre.



## PSHCE & RE:

In PSHE, the children will be learning about family and friendships and what good relationships look like.

In RE, the children will answer the key question 'How are important events remembered?'



#### Music:

The children have been looking at Rock and Roll. We have already begun by doing the 'hand jive', singing 'Rocking around the clock' by Bill Hayley and the unit will end with the children being

able to play and perform the walking bassline of 'Rocking around the clock' on a glockenspiel.
