Maths:

In maths, we will focus on consolidating our learning over our years in primary school. We will focus on the key skills needed for a smooth transition into high school such as: reading timetables, telling the time, algebra and shape work.

DT:

This half term, the children will brush up on their sowing skills in order to create appliques that will be added to personalise their costumes for the end of year play. The children will learn a range of stitches completed by their very own fair hands.

Science:

The children in science will step into the shoes of Charles Darwin as they begin to study the theory of evolution. The children will look at how humans evolved over time and will begin to look at life's big questions. By the end of the unit, the children will produce double page spreads.

History:

As historians we will discover how Human Rights were introduced. We will look at rights involving: age, gender, ethnicity, freedom of thought and religion. This unit of work, will open the children's eyes to the unfortunate discrimination and prejudice people have been subjected to throughout history. By the end of the unit, the children are going to be supported to construct an essay ready for history in Key Stage 3.

English:

What was that? It's a Monster Calls! This half term, the children will delve into the genre of horror to unleash their inner spooky writer. The children will advance speech through characters actions-building suspense throughout their narrative pieces.

Computing:

Data = Success! The children in their computing lessons, will learn how to create and interpret data using a range of software. The children will learn how to create formulas on Excel to reduce the time needed for human calculation. The children will then have the opportunity to apply this to real -life scenarios.

The children will continue their PE lessons with Mr Smith, who will be helping the children to prepare for Sports Day!

Swimming lessons will continue on a Wednesday, where the children will be assessed against the national swimming standard for primary school aged children.

In PSHE the children will be focusing on: transitioning to high school, peer pressure, awareness of alcohol and drugs in a child friendly manner according to statutory quidelines.
