The theme this year is 'Reading for Pleasure'.

Research shows that reading for pleasure is a vital indicator of a child's future success and we therefore put a lot of effort into encouraging a life-long habit of reading for pleasure in our West Vale Academy children.

This year in order to create excitement we are asking children to come dressed up as their favourite interesting Word!
